Once again, JPMorgan Chase has earned top marks for its inclusive and family-friendly policies. Both the Human Rights Campaign and Working Mother magazine have named JPMorgan Chase one of the best places to work.

Tops in flexibility

Working Mother named the company one of the 100 Best Companies for Working Moms for the 15th year in a row—which means JPMorgan Chase has now earned a spot in Working Mother Media's Hall of Fame.

The magazine applauded the firm's flexible work policies, "particularly in the wake of last year's acquisition of Bear Stearns and Washington Mutual, when the workload for many doubled."

Working Mother also rated companies' child care policies, benefits and advancement of women in the workplace—and noted that 43% of JPMorgan Chase managers are women.

First-rate policies

The company also scored a 100% rating on the Human Rights Campaign's Corporate Equality Index for the ninth year running. The index measures how well companies protect the rights and benefits of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) employees.

The index rates such criteria as diversity programs, benefits, non-discrimination policies and sponsorship of LGBT community events.

Companies with perfect scores are recognized as Best Places to Work by the organization. JPMorgan Chase has earned a perfect score every year since the index began in 2002.
