



Two of the most powerful women in banking

Two JPMorgan Chase executives have been named to the latest list of the 25 most powerful women in banking.

"The driving force behind this year's roster of honorees is the work these executives have done in steering their companies through the banking crisis," reports U.S. Banker, which published the rankings in the October 2009 edition of the publication.

For the third year running, Treasury & Securities Services CEO **Heidi Miller**—"arguably the highest-profile woman in banking"—tops the list.
